

### A Four-Year Project ...

#### The Team

- Team work is everything
- Approximately 150 people on PC & CC
- 10-20 people are the core of the operation; look after them
- Get buy in from the core people; make sure their tasks are not too big but also not too small
- There will be people who will get busy in their day job and cannot devote as much time to their night job—manage this!
- Be flexible
- Return e-mail to your most important people as fast as you can



## Organization

- Master plan
- Checklists galore
- The devil is in the details
- Think through the conference week and develop check lists
- Be ready three weeks before the conference
- Don't fall behind schedule; final deadline (conference) cannot be moved
- Every minute counts after the PC meeting to get the program on-line



#### **TMRF**

- Invest time to study, understand, and prepare the TMRF (2-3 weeks)
- The TMRF is a living document; evolve it and keep it up-to-date and current as much as possible
- It takes a long time for all the invoices to come in and clear
- Distributed versus centralized accounting
- What can be paid by ACM/IEEE?
- What has to be paid locally?

Provide lunch for both tuts and wks	99

#### Lessons Learned ... Canada

- Canada responded big time
  - Attendees
    - ⋆ Industry, Academia, Government
  - Sponsors
  - Organizers and volunteers
  - Content
  - Coast-to-Coast support
- Toronto was ideal
  - Westin Harbour Castle is great
  - Great City
  - Great resources



#### Lessons Learned ... Federated

- Federated conferences work
- Many conferences in one
- Workshops and tutorials could start on Saturday before the conference
- Workshops are really key
- Networking is critical
- Difference between a collocated conference and a workshop?
- Reserve more rooms for side meetings



#### Lessons Learned ... Tricks

- Conference calls did the trick
- Teamwork, teamwork, teamwork
- Time management is critical
- IEEE Editor for Proceedings was superb
- Graphics design is critical and extremely time consuming
- Web site design and management is critical for publicity, communication, coordination
- Contract with one printing house for all the printing and ad set up
- Workshop and tutorial contract



### Lessons Learned ... Quality

- Web site and printed materials
- Content of entire program
- Proceedings
- Manage workshop quality
- Speaker guidelines ©
- Common look-and-feel for events
- AV equipment and support
- Food and receptions
- Hotel: location, facilities, meeting rooms
- Internet café
- Student volunteers
- Attention to detail ©



### Lessons Learned ... Publicity

- High quality web site
- Each workshop has a web site
- Make sure other web sites link to us
- Inform workshop and tutorial chairs regularly of registration numbers
- Involve all program and conference committee members in publicity (e.g., link to ICSE web site)
- Stack publicity committee with senior and recognizable people
- E-mail, e-mail, e-mail



## Lessons Learned ... the hard way

- Maintaining ICSE corporate knowledge is an elusive goal and a major challenge
- Assume that some people who made commitments will get busy in their day job build it into project plan and manage it
- People you don't know should not be on the critical path
- Contract with a professional to negotiate with the hotel (3-4 years before the event)
- Experienced conference organizers have some spare hotel bedrooms in their pocket (R. Sameshima, Westin)
